Course Description

Covers principles of therapeutic communication, verbal, written, and electronic communications in the provision of EMS, documentation of elements of patient assessment, care and transport, communication systems, radio types, reports, codes and correct techniques.

Course learning outcomes

1. Demonstrate a fundamental understanding of interpersonal and small-group communication skills and be able to communicate effectively in a verbal and written format.
2. Use standard tools to resolve conflict in a manner beneficial and acceptable to all parties.
3. Accurately document an EMS scenario in a patient care report (PCR) as well as properly complete other commonly used written documents.
4. Have a basic understanding of two-way communications systems, the HEAR reporting system, radio operations, the role of the dispatch center in emergency services system.
5. Interact with other emergency service providers using a two-way radio and face-to-face.
6. Demonstrate the ability to report to a receiving medical facility the condition and interventions used with a specific patient being transported.
7. List basic procedures for answering and responding to emergency calls.
8. Demonstrate proper two-way radio use and etiquette.
